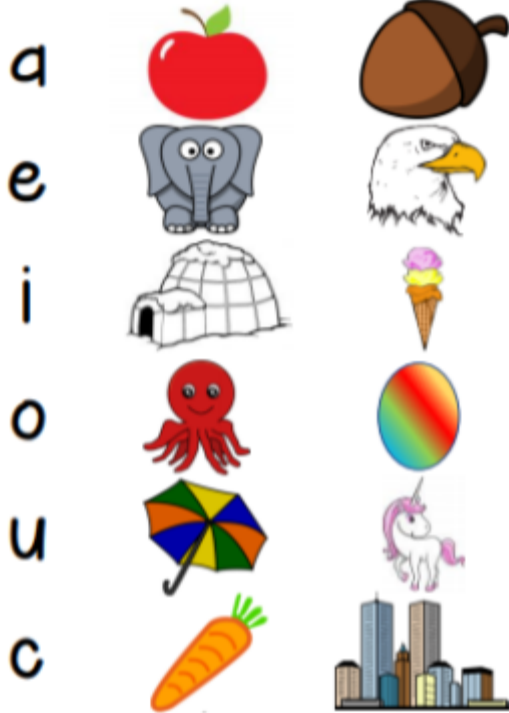


Decoding Strategies

Flip the Sound



Chunky Monkey
Look for a chunk you know.



Yes - t - er - day

Eagle Eye

Use the pictures to help read the word.



Stretchy Snake
S-T-R-E-T-C-H out the word.



When 2 vowels go walking...the first one does the talking. (the first vowel becomes a long vowel sound)



Sometimes y

ai ea ie oe
ee oa ue ay

rain bead cries
toes tree boat
blue stay

Sneaky E

Sneaky E on the end makes the vowel say it's name. (long vowel sound)

Tap → TapE

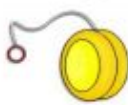

Cover up part of the word and read it one part at a time.

Handy Reading Strategies

Does that make sense?



Reading is **THINKING!**

Predict:

Use clues to infer what may happen.

Connect:

Use what I know to understand the text better.

Infer:

Use Clues and what I know to make sense of my reading.

Question:

Ask questions while reading.

Visualize:

Create mental images of what I am reading.

Summarize:

Determine which ideas are most important.
