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<u>Intellex Forensics</u>: The School District of Glenwood City has a fundamental responsibility to be effective stewards of the taxpayers' money. To provide complete transparency, the GCSD Board of Education approved a contract with <u>Intellex Forensics Advisory Services</u>, <u>Inc</u>. at the March 13, 2024 Board Work Session to conduct a forensic audit. The fee for conducting the forensic review of School District Glenwood City is capped at \$21,000. This process started last week and will continue for roughly six weeks. Final findings will be presented at a GCSD Board of Education Work Session in open session once the process is completed.

GCE Elementary Interim Principal: Ms. Haltinner, GCE Elementary Principal, will be on medical leave until April 15, 2024 as of today. We wish Ms. Haltinner all the best and a speedy recovery. She has spent the last seven years coaching school leadership teams for a federal DPI grant and also as a consultant to many area school districts as a reading specialist, curriculum development, Title 1 services, and student services consultant. Dr. Curtis will serve as the Glenwood City Elementary School Interim Principal for Ms. Haltinner who will be out on medical leave. Dr. Curtis will be joining our team for the following dates to start: Thursday, March 21, 2024 through April 15, 2024.



GCE Playground: On 2-26-24 the GCSD Board of Education approved moving forward with the Community Education construction project for this coming summer which includes our weight room and our wrap around program. Streaming and Hudl: The GCSD Board of Education approved the purchase of Hudl starting spring of 2024. Previously, GCHS football, volleyball, boys' and girls' basketball all purchased Hudl due to it being a Dunn/St. Croix Conference rule for video exchange and stats requirements. In most cases, these funds were paid for by either the individual sport budget or their respective booster clubs for a total of \$5,346. In addition, some sports either paid a statistician or used Hudl Assist for another fee ranging up to \$1,000 each. GCSD is the last District in the Dunn/St. Croix Conference to stream live events. After extensive research, HUDL and a GCSD You-Tube Channel is our best option. Per this Hudl agreement, any team, activity, or sport can have a Hudl Account. With this agreement a Hudl camera will be placed in GCHS Gym and also at the GCSD Stadium Press Box. For all other sports, Mr. Score (AD) and Mr. Kohler (IT) will work to secure an I-Pad to use for recording purposes. You will then be able to upload directly to your Hudl account if WI-FI is available at the time of the event or later when WI-FI is available.

GCSD 15+ Passenger Van Replacement: The School District of Glenwood City is replacing two of it vehicles based on the following; Under federal law, a school is prohibited from purchasing or leasing a new passenger van that is designed to seat 10 to 15 passengers if it will be used significantly by or on behalf of the school to transport students unless it has the required safety features. Likewise, a dealer is prohibited from selling or leasing such a van to a school district. Federal law does not govern the sale or lease of used vehicles and does not regulate the use of the vehicle after its purchase. That enforcement is dependent on state law. All Wisconsin school districts should be made aware that purchasing new 15 passenger vans (i.e., a van designed to seat 10-15 passengers) is in violation of federal law and those vans cannot be used for the transportation of students unless those vans meet all the required safety equipment requirements for a school bus. Click HERE to view full report. The current 2023-24 GCSD Budget includes \$35,000 for vehicle replacement needs. As soon as this information was discovered the GCSD ceased using these two vans as of February 8, 2024.
