Science or Social Studies	Social Skills and Manners: This week, we will work on turn taking, using manners, and being polite. These skills can be practiced while playing a game, at the dinner table, etc.				
Community Building	BOAT Challenge: build a boat out of any materials you have (legos, tin foil, straws, ect.) Predict whether your boat will sink or float and then test your hypothesis by filling your sink/tupperware bowl with water. Feel free to post pictures of your boats on our classroom Facebook page.
